

### Irenaeus of Sirmium

I. was a Bishop of Sirmium (present day Sremska Mitrovica in Serbia), one of the most important cities in the Roman province of Pannonia.<sup>1</sup> His martyrdom during the persecution under Diocletian and Maximian is described in the *Passio Sancti Irenaei episcopi Sirmiensis*<sup>2</sup>, which is preserved in Latin<sup>3</sup>, Greek<sup>4</sup> and Armenian<sup>5</sup>. Nevertheless, due to the lack of further studies in this area,<sup>6</sup> it is open to debate whether the Greek or the Latin version should be considered the original.<sup>7</sup> It is also unclear whether the *Passio* constitutes a document of historical value<sup>8</sup> or not<sup>9</sup>. According to the *Passio* I. had a wife and children. He was arrested by Probus, the prefect of Pannonia, for refusing to obey the imperial command to sacrifice to the pagan gods.<sup>10</sup> After Probus had interrogated him and had him tortured, I. was finally beheaded on April 6<sup>th</sup>, 304, on the *Pons Basentis*, and his body was thrown into the River Save.<sup>11</sup> In the Byzantine,<sup>12</sup> Armenian<sup>13</sup> and Ethiopian<sup>14</sup> Synaxarium, I. is commemorated on August 23<sup>th</sup>, whereas the *Martyrologium Hieronymianum*<sup>15</sup> and the *Breviarium Syriacum*<sup>16</sup> refer to his anniversary on April 6<sup>th</sup>. The *Martyrologium Romanum*<sup>17</sup> however, probably taking over a mistake (*VIII Kalendas Aprilis* instead of *VIII Idus Aprilis*) from the *Martyrologium of Lyon*<sup>18</sup>, gives March 25<sup>th</sup><sup>19</sup> as the date for his commemoration. A basilica from the 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> century A.D., dedicated to I., as well as his tomb, have been found in the area of Sirmium.<sup>20</sup>
